Along with the Ranger, EVFD was awarded funding to upgrade our wildland fire backpack sprayers!

#### ABOUT THE EMERADO FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Emerado Volunteer Fire Department was established in 1972 and is located within the city of Emerado, a small town of approximately 450 people, right in the heart of Grand Forks County, North Dakota. The Department was founded in 1972, and became an all-volunteer Fire and Rescue Department, responding to all types of calls for service.

The all-volunteer department of 25 active members is located several miles away from any other fire department and operates within 112 square miles of rural and urban countryside. The primary response area is divided into 3 major Townships, Oakville, Chester and Blooming, equaling a total populace of over 1000. The department faces many rescue challenges within its response area, including many miles of US Highway 2, a major highway that sees thousands of vehicles a day.

Along with US Highway 2, the Department responds to rescue operations along many more miles of rural roadways within its 112 square mile area. Within the response area, firefighters have to potential to perform operations at two fuel stations, a school, over 100 manufactured and mobile homes, a large manufacturing facility, a major distributer of fireworks, along with several hundred rural residences and federally protected wild-land and private croplands. All mutual aid fire departments are 15 to 30 minutes away.

In addition to the Departments own response area, the department provides mutual aid to surrounding fire departments several times a year with both manpower and equipment for rescue operations, as well as fires. These mutual aid agreements include the Grand Forks Air Force Base, which is a city within itself of over 2000 people. Providing mutual aid to other departments increases the response area to cover an additional 1308 square miles. All equipment, when practical, is available to the mutual aid departments by request.








# CALL VOLUME BY MONTH 2024




# CALL VOLUME BY DAY of the WEEK 2024



#### CALL VOLUME BY TIME OF DAY






## WATER USAGE BY GALLON 2020 - 2024
